

Amen Siakudumisa is a South African song of celebration and praise that can be performed a number of different ways.
This piece may be performed with SATB choir, women, men, children, or any combination of the above.

The arrangement here is only one suggestion for performance.

Please feel free to improvise and embellish the vocal lines, percussion parts, and movement.

The repeats can be taken as many times as desired.

Movement should generally consist of gentle swaying or walking and should remain dignified, as this song employs a sacred text.

Hand drums may also be incorporated (usually on the primary beats).

Djembe, congas, and other African instruments greatly enhance the performance of this piece.

If available, it would be appropriate to include African marimbas or xylophones, providing rhythmic and harmonic foundation.
